



# What Exit? Shore-Town Joyrides

With two of the busiest toll roads in the nation, NJ thrives on highway efficiency-spawning a well-known "What Exit?" culture of geographic shorthand.

The New Jersey Turnpike (NJT), opened in 1951, has since grown in length and width—with up to 14 lanes—essentially connecting NYC with Philadelphia. The Garden State Parkway (GSP), opened in 1954, provides a more scenic highway running the length of NJ near the Atlantic coastline. This road-to-sea adventure embarks at the Jersey Shore's northernmost point in Sandy Hook and cruises down to various shore points to terminate in Cape May's famous Exit 0. Take on the whole trip from top to bottom, or break them into separate county getaways. Buckle up – the beaches are calling!

#### MONMOUTH COUNTY ROAD TRIP

Sandy Hook to Manasquan (~29 miles)

Exit 117 leads to ocean and bay beaches on the slender Sandy Hook peninsula, where Gateway National Recreation Area offers immersion in nature. Just south, discover the majestic Twin Lights Historic Site—with two climbable lighthouse towers-in Highlands. Next, enjoy a nautical-themed lunch overlooking the Shrewsbury River at Beach Tavern in Monmouth Beach. Then head to Long Branch to walk the sands

of Seven Presidents Oceanfront Park, once a favored POTUS vacation spot. Continue to legendary Asbury Park, featuring boardwalk diversions, funky art and a beach for both surfers and sunbathers alike. In Belmar, travelers with kids will appreciate beach playgrounds, and those without will enjoy a date night at La Dolce Vita Ristorante. Next, view maritime history at Sea Girt Lighthouse, a stately homeand-tower combo. Conclude the journey at Manasquan's blissfully undeveloped shores at Fisherman's Cove Conservation Area.

Hit the road!







#### **OCEAN COUNTY ROAD TRIP**

Point Pleasant Beach to Beach Haven (~49 miles)

Take Exit 98 to family-friendly Point Pleasant Beach, where a no-frills beachfront breakfast awaits at The Food Shack before jumping on Jenkinson's Boardwalk for arcades, minigolf, rides and the aquarium. Just south, in Bay Head, bike along the dunes and historic district of the "Ivy League" beach town. From there, drive down the super-scenic Route 35 to a happening summer destination known as Seaside Heights. Perhaps spend the night at this stopover to thoroughly enjoy the amusement pier bursting with playful activities and a meal at Bum Rogers Crab House & Tavern in Seaside Park. Next, swing back onto the GSP and take Exit 63 to diverse destinations on Long Beach Island, from the "Boulevard" in Surf City and iconic lighthouse in Barnegat Light to Beach Haven, where action-packed water activities balance with charming shops and museums.

#### ATLANTIC COUNTY ROAD TRIP


#### Brigantine to Margate (~12 miles)

Exit 40 leads to peaceful Brigantine, a boardwalkfree haven full of salt-worn cottages and a two-story viewing platform to observe birds and dolphin pods. Brigantine is also one of the few N shore towns you can drive your 4x4 vehicle onto the beach—as long as a permit is obtained. Just a few minutes south, Atlantic City brings the bling with miles of boardwalk, games, concerts, retail, dining and casinos. Stop for oysters on the half shell and the Dean Martini at Knife & Fork Inn, an old-school chophouse dating back to 1912 that was a favorite of Bob Hope and Frank Sinatra. On the far side, the quaint coastal town of Ventnor presents a more relaxed side of beach life with surfable waves and a non-commercial boardwalk with the state's longest fishing pier. Drift slightly southward to the broad beaches of laid-back Margate, famed for Lucy the Elephant, a historic six-story architectural novelty like no other. Don't leave town without dropping in for happy hour and live music at upbeat local bar, Maynard's Cafe.

#### CAPE MAY COUNTY ROAD TRIP

#### Ocean City to Cape May Point (~36 miles)

Exit 30 leads to wholesome family vacation destination, Ocean City, famed for dazzling boardwalk attractions, famous pizza joints and endless activities. Heading south, collect shells or surf fish on Sea Isle City's five miles of shoreline before zipping to nearby Avalon, where the Avalon Dune and Beach Trail offers a spot to stretch your legs in unique coastal habitats. Don't leave town without people-watching at The Princeton Grill & Bar. Continue nature exploration at the island neighbor's idyllic Stone Harbor Bird Sanctuary, Next, get an adrenaline charge at The Wildwoods with free beaches and exhilarating boardwalk entertainment, including multiple roller coasters and waterparks. In adjacent Cape May, fold-out your beach chair before stopping at its namesake brewery, or stroll past Victorian gingerbread architecture and shop charming boutiques. Cruise down to the southernmost tip of the Jersey Cape, Cape May Point, to explore historical World War II sites and a lighthouse where 199 steps lead to ocean and bay views.

## **GARDENS OF THE GARDEN STATE**

#### NJ earned the license plate nickname thanks to fertile lands cultivated since colonial times.

Horticulturally speaking, what's in a name? Officially, arboretums are botanical gardens specializing in trees, shrubs and woody plants. This, of course, begs the definition of a botanical garden, which is a science-forward category for the study of plants. For strictly aesthetic purposes, there are rose gardens and myriad other collections of prodigious seasonal blooms. In fact, the NI Department of Agriculture cites more than five dozen "Gardens and Arboretums" across the state-many of which defy simple classification by incorporating a spectrum of eye-pleasing components among cultivated attractions. Many of the destinations woven across the landscape of the Garden State are open year-round and offer free admission, further enhancing the appeal of nature.



Connect with nature through lavish horticultural displays at Laurelwood Arboretum in Wayne, from The Sensory Garden to a Sculpture Trail.

Fans of wildflowers to Italianate gardens find plenty to admire at Ringwood's New Jersey Botanical Garden, surrounded by 1,000 woodland acres.

Feel immersed in the harmonious melding of nature and grand architecture among the gardens and pathways of Greenwood Gardens in Short Hills.

Catch the vibrant peak of favorite flora at Van Vleck House & Gardens, near downtown Montclair, with a weekly "What's Blooming" website preview.

Famed for dramatic rock gardens, the wooded stream valley trails of Leonard J. Buck Garden in Far Hills are bedecked with ferns and flowers.


Rutgers Gardens, a horticultural hotspot in North Brunswick, combines woodlands with hugely varied garden displays.

Gorgeous trees and flowers abound at Bernardsville's Cross Estate Gardens, which features a stunning wisteria-covered pergola.

The Big Tree Tour, Rose Walk and Nature Trail count among the serene amenities at The Frelinghuysen Arboretum in Morristown.

Sights at Deep Cut Gardens in Middletown include a rockery, greenhouse, rose parterre and Japanese-themed garden for home gardening inspo.

NJ's oldest pick-your-own, **Battleview Orchards in** Freehold, boasts freshpressed cider, a country store and tempting bakery.

Four generations of family farmers can be found at Beneduce Vineyards in Pittstown, specializing in smallbatch, estate-grown wines, tastings and Sunday picnics.






Heaven Hill Farm in Vernon pairs a vast garden center with a farm market of just-picked produce, locally raised meats, cheese, honey and bakery goods.

Discover fields of blooms, shop soothing essential oils or take an alpaca for a walk at Hidden Spring Lavender & Alpaca Farm in Skillman.








#### **Happy Harvest**

Did you know New Jersey is home to more than 9,900 farms covering 750,000 acres of farmland? With numbers like that, and a strong growing environment for crops to flourish, the Garden State remains among the nation's leaders in agricultural production-with farmers producing more than 100 different kinds of fruits and vegetables. Nationally, NJ ranks in the top 10 producers of cranberries, peaches, tomatoes, bell peppers, eggplant, cucumbers, apples, squash and spinach. # **HALL OF FAME** FOODS On the Menu

New Jersey's cuisine scene may be as diverse as its landscapes, but there's no denying that these iconic foods put this great state on the map, with culinary connections now known the world over.

#### Pizza

Arguably the standout staple food of NJ Italian culture, you're never far from a satisfying slice or tomato pie with over 2,000 pizzerias in the state. Whether you're looking for a spot with decades of tradition serving a thin and crispy crust, family-run restaurants baking saucy Grandma Pies or chef-driven pizza parlors with creative takes, there's a reason NI is known as one of the "Best Pizza States in the US."

#### Italian Ice / Water Ice

It's the perfect reprieve from hot summer days down the shore or at the ballpark. The descendant of the Italian dessert (granita), this fruity frozen treat is made from softtextured ice, sugar and various flavorings—from traditional cherry and mango to watermelon, grape and cotton candy.

#### Diner-Style Disco Fries

New Jersey isn't called the "Diner Capital of the World" for nothing. While our Northern neighbors in Canada call this guilty pleasure poutine, Jerseyans call them "disco fries." Found at select diners across the state, this groovy dance of French fries comes traditionally topped with a savory brown or chicken gravy and loaded with creamy melted mozzarella cheese for the ultimate diner indulgence or late-night snack.

#### Hoagies / Subs

Deli *sub*culture is one-of-a-kind in the Northeast, and hoagies are on the menu. Pile 'em high with thinly sliced cured meats, such as capicola, prosciutto and soppressata, then American or provolone cheese. Garnish with the works and don't forget the soft, chewy hoagie roll for a proper NJ sandwich.

The decadent Sicilian pastry dessert has many different personalities—from the crispy or flaky-soft shell to the classic sweet or tangy ricotta cream filling. Why not toss in pistachios or chocolate chips to the fried pastry delicacy? Whether on-the-go to bring to Sunday dinner or dipped in espresso at a local bistro, cannolli topped with powdered sugar can be enjoyed any time of day.



#### Pork Roll / Taylor Ham

It all depends on the geography of your bagel shop, deli or cafe, and how you order this classic Jersey sandwich. If you find yourself in South Jersey, be sure to call it pork roll, but if you're making your way up state, northerners say Taylor ham.

The salted pork slices developed in 1856 have risen to fame over the last century and are now a beloved go-to breakfast staple for locals and out-of-towners alike.





#### Saltwater Taffy

When you think of classic boardwalk fare, saltwater taffy comes to mind. Brine is not an ingredient in this guilty pleasure, but the lore of its "happy accident" creation has kept the candy a household name for decades. You can find these sticky delights hand-pulled or whipped by machine all summer long. No day down the shore is complete without a handful of this stuck-in-your-teeth treat.

#### Aquariums

Aquatic exhibits—without seasonal boundaries-provide immersion in watery worlds, from a shark tunnel at Adventure Aquarium in Camden to global marine life habitats at Jenkinson's Aquarium in Point Pleasant Beach. Or meet 3,000 underwater creatures at SEA LIFE® New Jersey Aquarium in East Rutherford.

#### Water Parks

Make waves year-round at East Rutherford's DreamWorks Water Park, with world record-breaking slides and rides. Go wild or float in style in Wildwood at Splash Zone, or discover a mighty river shipwreck at Raging Waters. Find splashy fun at Mountain

Creek Waterpark's Colorado River Rapids & Surf Hill, or take on the Legendary Canyon Cliffs.

#### Boardwalk Fun

Playful activities abound at seaside wooden walkways, including amusements at Steel Pier in Atlantic City and Morey's Piers in Wildwood. Let loose at Ocean City escape rooms or puttputt at Point Pleasant Beach. Enjoy sky-high Ferris wheel views in Seaside Heights or retro arcade action in Asbury Park.

Leap, bounce, climb and swing at multiple indoor Urban Air Adventure & Trampoline Park locations.

#### Amusement & Theme Parks

Open 365 days a year, Nickelodeon Universe® American Dream unleashes the inner cartoon-loving child of all ages. In Jackson, fuel the adrenaline at Six Flags Great Adventure's countless thrill rides, 14 world-class coasters and a wildlife-filled safari excursion of 1,200 animals from six continents. In Beach Haven, Fantasy Island Amusement Park hosts a classic carousel, carnival rides and games to excite the entire family.



# ALBUM OF ADVENTURES

From exhilarating arenas to quirky clubs, music fans can stage dive (figuratively) into live shows infused with energizing rhythms. Every venue and vibe contributes to NI's ever-evolving music culture.

A tuneful revolution launched in 1877 when Thomas Edison unveiled the phonograph—making music recordable and shareable—at his West Orange laboratory in 1877. By the 1930s, Newark emerged as an incubator for jazz clubs and recording studios, with Atlantic City showcasing evolving musical styles. Decades later, New Brunswick's "basement scene" spawned a recording label boom, while crowds in Asbury Park rocked out at legendary (and still lively) music venues like Stone Pony, House of Independents, Convention Hall and more.

At Transparent Clinch Gallery, fan over Springsteen artifacts and a life-sized photo wall of the 'Born to Run' superstar (a track celebrating its 50th anniversary this year). For an archetypal standingroom experience, head to Starland Ballroom in Sayreville for a lineup of local and visiting artists. For supersized venues with indoor-outdoor concert seating, catch leading bands and musicians at Camden's waterfront Freedom Mortgage Pavilion or PNC Bank Arts Center in Holmdel. And in Newark, the Prudential Center box office brings in big-name acts for arena-size performances, while the New Jersey Performing Arts Center offers incredible live acoustics in a breathtaking theater. Thanks to the Hoboken Historical Museum, you can pay tribute to ol' Blue Eyes by retracing his footsteps to significant locales on a Frank Sinatra Walking Tour.







#### Jersey Roots Bear Musical Fruits

What do quintessential crooner Frank Sinatra and heartland rocker Bruce Springsteen have in common? Being born and raised in NJ, of course! Other homegrown or transplanted musical talents spanning myriad genres include Whitney Houston, Frankie Valli, Jon Bon Jovi, Kool & the Gang, Fugees, Lauryn Hill, Ice-T, Blues Traveler, Celia Cruz and more.



Whether salt-laden or ultrafresh, the healing waters of New Jersey offer a tonic for both body and mind.

With a staggering 60+ beaches spanning 130 miles of coastline, over 6,400 miles of rivers and streams, countless waterfalls and more than 400 publicly accessible lakes and reservoirs, the "Blue Mind" theory is strong in NJ. Being in, on or by a body of water does the soul good, and with landscapes like ours, wellness runs deep here.

#### FROM BEACH TO BAY

Strands of shoreline running the length of the coast offer a wide range of activities and experiences for the avid water sportsman and woman. Cast a line right off Ventnor Fishing Pier or at uncrowded Horseshoe Cove in Sandy Hook Bay. For deep-sea charters, from the Delaware Bay to offshore canyons, tackle up with Free Spirit Fishing in Margate or stay inshore for fly fishing with Fish Head Charters in Ship Bottom. Get your kicks parasailing with Belmar Parasail, rent jet skis at Beesleys Point or paddle out into the surf when visiting Manasquan Inlet. Dock your boat on the banks of Raritan Bay for a NYC skyline vantage point or tow tube across the waters of Barnegat Bay. Paddleboard into the sunset on Sea Isle City's bay side, or bodysurf the waves on the Atlantic side. Head into the back bay sounds of Avalon on a family-friendly crabbing trip with the captain and crew of Miss Avalon Fishing Charters.







#### LIFE ON THE LAKE

Beaches aren't the only coastal attraction in NJ. With hundreds of publicly accessible lakes in the state, waterbased activities aren't limited to those with sandy toes. Hop aboard your choice of watercraft at Wawayanda Lake in Hewitt or take the boat for a cruise around Lake Hopatcong in Hopatcong State Park. Take a refreshing dip before setting your tent up at Atsion Lake and falling asleep beneath the stars to the sounds of water lapping on the shore. Let the kids go swimming, crabbing or canoeing at Hooks Creek Lake in Cheesequake State Park in Matawan. Venture to the lakeside restaurants and marinas fringing seven-mile-long Greenwood Lake in West Milford, where diving, rowing and waterskiing triggers a state of 'happy.'

#### CHASING WATERFALLS

Some of the most breathtaking views can be found in New Jersey's very own backyard. Look up and marvel at Buttermilk Falls-the tallest waterfall in New Jersey-when visiting the **Delaware Water Gap National** Recreation Area in Hardwick, or test your map deciphering skills and join the hunt for Silver Spray Falls (or "Hidden Falls"). Feel humbled beside a 77-foot roaring cascade at Paterson Great Falls National Historical Park, home to one of the nation's largest waterfalls, while **Coppermines Trail Cascades** offers a more modest, tranquil reward at the end of your trek.

\*Access to Buttermilk Falls from Walpack Center is currently closed due to bridge repairs. To access the Falls, take Strubel Rd. to Dimon Rd. through Stokes State Forest.

# NOSTALGIA LIVES HERE

Voyage to the vintage, embrace history and the past, take home throwback treasures and embellish the future with a new appreciation of bygone times.

#### Thrift & Antique **Destinations**

Front Street in Keyport offers assorted vintage shops catering to the functional-nostalgia trend for goods like vinyl LPs, Pyrex dishware and retro lamps. Prowl yesteryear shops and estate finds along the riverside streets of Lambertville-known as the "Antiques Capital of NJ"-or hunt rare finds at the indoor-outdoor Golden Nugget Antique & Flea Market. Explore a co-op treasure trove of vintage finds at The Old Mill Antique Mall, a red roadside barn in Mullica Hill including two floors' worth of collectible coins, sports memorabilia, tools and toys. Period-style paintings, mirrors, vintage dolls, glassware, cast iron urns, fountains and more catch the eye at The Andover Village collection of shops. Collingswood's Downtown **Haddon Avenue** attracts thrifters and collectors to appealing shops selling everything from mid-century modern furniture to pinball machines.

#### **Architectural Gems**

Check out retro digs in The Wildwoods, aka "Doo-Wop Capital of the World," boasting the largest collection of midcentury modern hotels/motels, "Fabulous Fifties" commercial buildings and vibrant neon signs. With more than 600 charming cottages and buildings, Cape May Historic District is pure eye candy for fans of resplendent late-Victorian architecture. N/s newest luxury retreat, Pendry Natirar, brings contemporary majesty to the renovated Tudor-Style Mansion, located on a 90-acre estate in Peapack. Catch a concert at a former 1937 Art Deco-style movie house, The Landis Theater in Vineland, with a revamped neon façade welcoming tribute bands, magicians and more. Glimpse into early America at Historic Cold Spring Village, recreating life in the Gilded Age with meticulously restored homes, a brewery, school and trade shops that showcase authentic period details and craftsmanship.






#### Time-Capsule Museums

Compelling tales of centuries past resonate in the grounds and buildings of the pre-Revolutionary Old Barracks Museum in Trenton. Step inside a zinc mine that delves into the region's rich mining history and become dazzled by touchable fluorescent minerals at Sterling Hill Mining Museum in Ogdensburg. Embrace railroadiana at Whippany Railway Museum, with outdoor displays of restored train excursions and a caboose ride option, or tour Northlandz, the World's Largest Miniature Wonderland & Model Railroad Museum. With automotive history that'll make you want to pull the brakes, there's always a new detour on memory lane at the Vintage Automobile Museum of New Jersey in Point Pleasant. As a working maritime village, Tuckerton Seaport & Baymen's Museum keeps the area's nautical traditions and boat-building heritage alive.





#### **Spotlight on Lighthouses**

Once brightly lit beacons for mariner safety in the Atlantic Ocean for centuries, 23 lighthouses still line the Jersey shorelines (with 11 welcoming visitors). Look up at history at an unusual 1764 octagonal tower in Sandy Hook—NJ's oldest—or at the traditional cone design of the state's tallest in Absecon. Towers tucked into lighthouse keepers' homes stand tall in Hereford Inlet while a museum resides at Barnegat Light's one-room former schoolhouse at the tip of Long Beach Island.

Want to see them all? There's no better time than the third weekend of October, when the annual **Lighthouse Challenge of New Jersey** takes place, challenging visitors to hit 11 lighthouse sites, three lifesaving stations and one museum over the two-day weekend. A small registration fee enables you to collect a souvenir from each site!

# CITY **ESCAPES**

Happy Trails & High Summits

For those looking to escape the city lights and busy streets of the city, it's time to shake the misconception that NI is all industry and highways. Find untouched beauty and serenity atop our many mountain peaks or rugged pinelands. With 12 national park sites and 49 state parks and forests to choose from, your weekend escape just got a lot more adventurous.

#### **Outback Wilderness**

Break out the binoculars in Pinelands National Reserve, the country's first National Reserve spanning a staggering one million acres of farms, forests and wetlands. Located less than 30 miles from NYC's Times Square, Great Swamp National Wildlife Refuge provides a natural oasis in an otherwise largely suburban area where foot traffic and trails prevail over all other forms of transportation. With skyscrapers in the distance and trails built off of old logging roads, Norvin Green State Forest is a great place to test your abilities and elevation stamina along the Highlands Trail. For more than just a hike, check out Worthington State Forest, and you might stumble upon one of NJ's Seven Natural Wonders, Sunfish Pond.

#### **Gaining Elevation**

The Garden State's highest point, aptly named High Point State Park, dishes out spectacular panoramic views of New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania at over 1,800 feet of elevation. Kittatinny Mountain Range includes a sweeping overlook of the Delaware Water Gap on Mount Tammany, and is a prime spot for challenging hiking, rock climbing and wildlife watching. Saddle up in the Watchung Mountains, with great riding trails and a public stable, or explore unmarked trails with your pup along one of the three low ridges of volcanic origin. Experience some of the state's best trout fishing at the Musconetcong River, or grab your adventure buddies for mountain biking and sledding in Allamuchy

Mountain State Park.





#### **Just Passing Through**

For 72.4 miles, the prestigious Appalachian National Scenic Trail runs through New Jersey along the long-winded ridge of Kittatinny Mountain Range. Thru-hikers will also venture into Worthington State Forest, Wallkill River National Wildlife Reserve, High Point State Park and the Ramapo Mountains' forested chain fringing the New York/New Jersey border.







#### **Action-Packed Resorts**

**Mountain Creek Resort** in Vernon offers four seasons of outdoor fun. When snow falls, skiers and boarders flock to the slopes and freestyle terrain, while warmer weather attracts adventurers to the bike park and a mountaintop zip-line course.

Fish the quarry, hike wooded nature trails, test your archery skills and grab your clubs to play on the 18-hole natural grass putting course at year-round playground **Crystal Springs Resort** in Hamburg.

For winter family fun, grab your day or season passes for an alpine escape to go cross-country or downhill skiing at **Campgaw Mountain Ski Center** in Mahwah. Snow tubing is also always a crowd-pleaser.

# AMPGROUNDS & CASING

Pitch a tent under a black sky or bet it all on black in roulette—whatever your OOO looks like, there's something for you in the Garden State. With seven different regions for your camping adventure, NJ offers landscapes for both glamping fifth-wheelers or paddle-in primitive campers. If neither are your style, casinos and luxury hotels can be found on the shoreline and beyond, offering a mix of amenities, entertainment and culinary experiences for the discernible traveler.




#### Set Up Camp

Jellystone Park in Williamstown is a family-centric Yogi Bear-themed campground that makes for lifelong vacation memories with everything from a huge activity pool and jumping lake floats to laser tag, sports courts and themed events. For a real rugged retreat (no vehicle access), Round Valley Recreation Area Campground is the only NJ State Park that offers wilderness camping-so be prepared to either backpack, mountain bike, boat or paddle to your secluded campsite in the woods. Panther Lake

Camping Resort in Andover is known for its namesake, a beautiful 45-acre freshwater lake and gorgeous scenery. About as close to camping on the beach as you can get without the sea birds and sand, Surf & Stream Campground in Toms River is sublime for a quiet getaway to cook over the campfire and connect with nature. If fishing is your thing, Windy Acres RV Park & Campground in Newton allows you to cast from the comfort of your campsite and provides Wi-Fi throughout the park to share your next trophy catch with your online friends.









#### Raise the Stakes

Spice up your vacation with a burlesque show at the Borgata Hotel Casino & Spa, or indulge in some self-care at the onsite spa, salon or barbershop. With Atlantic City Beach and Steel Pier just steps away, check in to the iconic Hard Rock Hotel & Casino and test your luck at one of the 5,000 slot machines or rock out at a Sound Waves concert. Ocean Casino Resort, the newest addition to the casino lineup in Atlantic City, dazzles travelers with its striking glass facade, luxury studio suites and a private Blade helicopter ride to/from NYC that'll make you feel like an action hero. Originally opened in the early 80s, Tropicana Atlantic City knows how to entertain with games of chance, themed restaurants and disco events at their nightclubs to dance the night away. As one of the top-rated sportsbooks in the nation, Caesars Atlantic City is the place to wine and dine like royalty for those willing to chance the parlay in an opulent Roman setting, including nine highlyrated restaurants on property.

#### **EXPAND YOUR MIND**



Three-dimensional art and nature meld into an immersive aesthetic experience at the mesmerizing Grounds for Sculpture in Hamilton.

#### RETRACE HISTORY

Steeped in Revolutionary history, the Heritage Trail of Somerset County in Bridgewater offers themed bus and walking tours. Worthington State Forest (~3.6 miles, 1,213 ft. elevation, hard) - Take the Red Dot Trail up and the Blue Dot Trail down for a semi-challenging loop with views the entire way.

#### STAIRWAY TO HEAVEN

Wawayanda State Park (~2.6 miles, 889 ft. elevation, moderate) - This out-and-back trail is a popular, year-round route for birding, dog walking and trail running.

#### SWAMP, SUMMIT & GHOST LAKE

 Jenny Jump State Forest (~5.5 miles, 1,059 ft. elevation, moderate) - Roam the rocky terrain for views of surrounding mountains and valleys before arriving at Ghost Lake.

O Schooley's Mountain County Park (~2.4 miles, 600 ft. elevation, easy to moderate) - Pass large boulders, waterfalls and Lake George for a stretch on this scenic trail.

O Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area (~6.7) miles, 1,443 ft. elevation, hard) - Meet fellow hikers as you explore the ravines and ridges of this popular loop.
